This Year 11 Guide is designed to help parents support their child in succeeding in their GCSEs and other examinations. Below are some proven steps to success that, through experience, we know give students the best chance of achieving their desired results:

ATTEND SCHOOL

We need your support in encouraging our Year 11 students to commit to their success by ensuring they attend school every day. Research shows that students with 95% attendance or higher are significantly more likely to achieve five 9-5 grades at GCSE. This achievement opens up more opportunities for your child post-16.

TAKE PART IN REVISION

On average, students who attend our revision sessions improve on their mock results by 2 whole grades!

SESSIONS

PERIOD 6

Period 6 classes offer students a valuable opportunity to revisit and clarify concepts they may not have fully understood during regular classes. These sessions allow teachers to address areas of confusion, provide additional support, and help students build a stronger understanding, fostering a sense of confidence and support.

TAILORED REVISION

Tailored revision sessions will begin in Term
2. These small group sessions will take place between 4:00 and 5:00 PM. Attendance is by invitation; however, parents may request an invitation for their child.

SATURDAY SESSIONS

Saturday sessions will begin in Term 2 and will be tailored based on mock exam results.

These sessions are designed to provide targeted support for additional learning.

PERIOD 0

On the mornings of major exams, students will be offered a Revision Booster session starting at 7:30 AM, with breakfast provided.

Revision Tips

HELPING YOUR CHILD WITH REVISION



REVISING EARLY

Starting early can help students avoid panic and stress, it can help them to get into good habits and they will be able to remember more of the material. Check in with them and their progress.



MORE THAN READ

Students will only remember around 10% of what they read. Help them by testing them and getting your child to write things down. When children summarise key points from their revision book in their own words, it can help them retain a lot more of the information.



TIDY & QUIET

A revision spot with good lighting, the right stationary and no distractions such as the television or their mobile phone can help a child focus a lot more. Children focus best when the environment is quiet and tidy.

Student Wellbeing

At ICA, we want to support your child's wellbeing especially at times that can be intense and stressful.

Sitting exams is an experience that can lead to feelings of stress and worry for many students.
