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**OVERVIEW** 

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Our GCSE Music course is aligned to the Eduqas GCSE Music specification. There are 3 components: Performing (30%); Composing (30%) and Appraising (40%). The main focus of Y10 is to Develop skills across all 3 components and study all Areas of Study. Pupils are encouraged to take lessons with MAPAS Music Service to support with their performing work. Singing is integral to our curriculum at ICA and we encourage pupils to join our school choir (available through the ASPIRE offer).

During the first term pupils are welcomed to the department and understand the expectations of the course over the following two years.

During the first term pupils are introduced to the key skills required across all 3 Components of the course. Pupils will become more familiar with how to read a range of notation methods – e.g. staff notation, chord symbols, etc. Alongside this, pupils explore composition though an iterative approach with guidance on how to control melody and harmony.

Pupils begin studying AoS4 – Popular Music by considering a range of styles and music concepts – e.g. pop, reggae, etc.

Pupils continue to develop both their solo and ensemble performing skills. Feedback is regularly provided to pupils from both staff, peers and themselves. During this final term of Y10, pupils perform their repertoire to their Music Teacher and a decision is made as to whether easier repertoire is required.

During this final term of Y10, pupils complete their Free Composition and complete the relevant entry in their Composing Log via the Eduqas template.

Pupils study AoS2 – Music for Ensemble (e.g. jazz and blues, musical theatre, etc.) and AoS3 – Film Music – e.g. leitmotif and minimalism
